## Senator Gallivan Honors Six Correction Officers December 31, 2014

Senator Patrick M. Gallivan (R-C-I, Elma) recognized six New York State Correction Officers for their quick response in rescuing two people from a [school bus accident](#) in the Town of Sardinia (Erie County) on October 30, 2014. Each officer was presented with a Proclamation from Senator Gallivan during a ceremony on December 16<sup>th</sup> at the Gowanda Correctional Facility.

Correction Officers Bobseine, Dryzmala, Griffey, Pagels, Rice and Southworth were traveling to Attica Correctional Facility for training on the morning of October 30 when they came upon a school bus that slid off Route 39. The officers immediately pulled over, directed traffic around the accident scene and rescued the female driver and a young boy from the bus. Neither the bus driver nor the passenger was injured.
