Lakeview Employee Resource Information Day



On November 12th, the Lakeview's Employee Assistance Program Committee hosted an Employee Resource Information Day with coffee and doughnuts in the morning and complimentary lunch for staff and representatives. A total of 21 non-profit agencies with participated. Staff participated in a fundraiser raffle for the Lakeshore Humane Society raising \$169,000 and two boxes of donated items.
