

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INMATE GRIEVANCE TRENDS AND ANALYSIS

There were 17,596 grievances filed through June 30, 2010. This reflects a decrease of 1,337 grievances from the 18,933 grievance submissions realized during the same period in 2009. The Central Office Review Committee (CORC) responded to 5,757 grievance appeals in 2010, a decrease of 1,017, or 15% from the 2009 total of 6,774 grievance appeals. The CORC appeals are addressed in a subsection below.

The areas experiencing the most grievance activity are: (1) Code 22, Medical; (2) Code 49, Staff Conduct; (3) Code 23, Housing-Internal Block Affairs; (4) Code 30, Package Room; and (5) Code 24, Special Housing Units. It is noted that last year Code 3, Correspondence replaced Code 24, Special Housing Units, however, this year Code 24 replaced Code 3 as the 5th most grieved area. The grievance activity for the other codes remained in the same order as last year.

The top five categories account for 51% of all grievances filed in the first six months of 2010. All comparisons in this report will be for the time periods of January 1 - June 30, 2009 and January 1 - June 30, 2010, unless otherwise stated. Please refer to the annexed chart "Most Grieved Areas By % Filed For 2002 - 2009" for an historical overview.

A brief synopsis of the major categories indicates the following:

MEDICAL - CODE 22

In 2010, the number of medical grievances filed was 3,452 compared to 3,646 in 2009, a decrease of 194 medical grievances, representing a decrease of 5%. This category was 19.6% of the total grievances filed, an increase from the 19.3% last year.

The grievances can be attributed to the inmates who regularly file numerous medical complaints for real or perceived medical problems, and do so at any facility in which they are housed. Thus, many of the issues presented remain constant in this category. It is believed that some medical grievances are filed in order to create a record of the grievant's request for medical attention or in an attempt to enhance medical treatment. There are grievances filed where the requested action is cited as a health concern, even though the request may be non-medical in nature.

In addition, there are differences between what inmates ask for as part of their treatment plans and what the physicians order. Inmates tend to self-diagnose and expect the treatment that they prefer. The increasing trend in medical grievances involving Hepatitis B and C, and Tuberculosis issues has continued. Inmates diagnosed with these diseases often request care by outside specialists and specific medications. The perception by inmates that recommendations made by outside consultants must be implemented by the Facility Health Services Director (FHSD) also gives rise to medical complaints. Further, there are complaints where the FHSD made a recommendation for treatment which was then denied by managed care. Requests for cosmetic surgery, (i.e., removal of tattoos and scars), elective surgery and other medical procedures not in accordance with the Department's Health Services Manual, nor ordered by the FHSD, account for some of the medical grievances filed.

Some of the medical grievances are actually requests for items such as large handcuffs on trips, boxer shorts, bed boards, orthopedic shoes, medical permits for specific housing, additional showers and special diets. As the number of wheelchair inmates increases, grievances are filed for wheelchair repairs and accessories. In other medical complaints, the medical documentation for the condition cited by the grievant does not exist, or the grievant has a condition that is being addressed by health staff. Access to outside consultants and specialists is also a factor in the number of medical grievances filed. This supports the belief that the perception of illness or medical need is a factor in the number of medical complaints filed. Combined with the perception of illness, actual illnesses of the inmate population can be cited as reasons for the number of medical grievances. It is noted that the Department's policy of consolidating outside trips has resulted in complaints regarding the length of time inmates spend in restraints and in the holding pens, as well as the length of time traveling to appointments. In addition, inmates often request transfers to a facility that can accommodate their medical needs.

There are some housing unit issues which directly impact medical grievance numbers. Wheelchair inmates file ADA related grievances, and some of the issues include handicap pat frisks, accessibility to vans and recreation, proper medical supplies and medical treatment. Some inmates cite health reasons for not being suitable for top bunks/double cells and seek medical orders for the bottom bunks/single cells. Window cubes and other housing situations preferred by inmates also impact medical complaints, as poor health and fear of contagious diseases are cited as reasons for needing the requested housing.

STAFF CONDUCT - CODE 49

In 2010, the number of staff conduct grievances filed was 2,981 compared to 3,313 in 2009, a decrease of 332 staff conduct grievances, representing a decrease of 10%. This category is 16.9% of the total grievances filed, a decrease from the 17.5% last year.

The factors attributed to staff conduct grievances have remained constant throughout the years. A significant number of staff conduct grievances are attributed to inmate interaction with staff involving misbehavior reports and an attempt to discredit the staff. In some facilities, inexperienced staff do have an impact on staff/inmate interaction. Other factors believed to account for the staff conduct complaints are direct orders being perceived as harassment by inmates and officers conducting more efficient pat frisks.

Complaints which impact this category include an inmate's failure to follow procedures which results in the loss of an activity or an option. An example of this is when an inmate neglects to respond to announcements concerning movement to a certain area and is then not permitted to go after the movement has ended. This results in grievances due to the perception of unfair treatment, deliberate omission, or that staff involved could have made an exception. The logistics involved in coordinating activities and movement of large groups of people has not been traditionally appreciated by inmates who file this type of complaint, especially when the result is strict adherence to rules governing callouts, attendance and movement. Based on the above staff/inmate interactions, the number of staff conduct complaints is likely to remain high when compared to other categories.

HOUSING-INTERNAL BLOCK AFFAIRS - CODE 23

In 2010, the number of housing-internal block affairs grievances filed was 1,025 compared to 1,154 in 2009, a decrease of 129 grievances, representing a decrease of 11%. This category is 5.8% of the total grievances filed, a decrease from the 6.1% last year.

Issues concerned policies on lockers, ladders for climbing into the top bunk, and bunk furniture arrangements. Complaints were also filed by inmates about areas for worship, cell equipment, shower stall conditions, rubber mats for shower stalls, cleanliness of common areas, ADA accommodations for handicapped inmates, extermination services for pest control, hygiene supplies, cell cleaning time and supplies, common area cleaning, and better mattress sanitizing.

The above grievances are intended to demonstrate the variety of complaints filed in this category and do not represent a complete list of housing unit complaints. Some housing unit complaints are seasonal in nature and either increase or decrease according to the weather conditions, such a housing unit temperatures This can affect the number of grievances related to maintenance.

Some housing complaints are directly related to an inmate being moved to another unit due to a change in program assignment. For facilitation of inmate movement and other security concerns some facilities determine inmate housing location according to program assignment. Some inmates understandably object to being moved out of cell locations in which they have been for any length of time, since moving represents adjustments to different staff and different inmates. In addition, the location of a particular block may be preferred by the inmate for various reasons.

PACKAGE ROOM - CODE 30

In 2010, the number of package room grievances filed was 807 compared to 819 in 2009, a decrease of 12 grievances, representing a decrease of 1.5% This category is 4.6% of the total grievances filed, an increase from the 4.3% last year.

The numbers in this category are viewed as an indication of inmate and package room staff differences of opinion in what is allowed and what is prohibited in accordance with Departmental Directive #4911. In June 2010 the package room directive was revised and provided clarification on the items allowed through the package room. However, the revision had no direct impact on the minimal decrease in grievances in this category.

Issues involved requests for radios, specifically the Sangean brand, requests for sneakers with that material which created a mesh like pocket, requests for footwear with sports team logos, disagreements concerning restricted colors in clothing and linen, validity of item receipts, requests for increases in the current limitation of value for certain items listed in Directive #4911 and local permit items. Directive #4911 provides the superintendent discretion to authorize and specify the terms and conditions of the local permit. This, at times, results in complaints because certain items may be allowed at one facility but disallowed at the next facility, i.e., musical instruments, beard trimmers and hot pots, due to the physical characteristics of a facility.

The packaging and permissibility of food items are frequently grieved due to the subjective interpretation of what is hermetically sealed (meaning impervious to outside influence). In the food category, desired items often fail to meet either packaging guidelines or are not among the listed items approved for receipt in Directive #4911. The new revision to this directive clarified the types of seals that are allowed.

The inspection of items entering the facility via the package room is another subject of complaints. Inmates object to the necessary opening, unwrapping and searching of items coming through the package room. In clothing and footwear complaints the issues are generally about design features, prohibited colors, designer logos, monetary value of the item and the item not being listed as an approved item.

Package room grievances have been affected by the technological advances in the design and variety of items permitted via the package room, as exhibited by the now broad range of options available in sneaker and shoe construction. The same is true of typewriters, radios, cassette tape players and many other items. Merchandise advertising via the television media, radio, catalogs and newspapers enables the incarcerated to be an informed consumer group. The resulting desire for products unacceptable for receipt via the package room impacts on grievance numbers.

SPECIAL HOUSING UNITS - CODE 24

In 2010, the number of special housing unit grievances filed was 781 compared to 685 in 2009, an increase of 96 grievances, representing an increase of 14%. This category is 4.4% of the total grievances filed, an increase from the 3.6 % last year.

The nature of the special housing unit results in inmate requests for restricted items that they want to have, or permitted items the inmates want more of. The following are examples of some requested items: radio headset, nail clippers, toothbrush with full size handle, cleaning supplies, galoshes and books.

Some complaints concern procedural issues such as the administration of cell shields, restraints, deprivation orders, and exercise. Inmates also challenge the Progressive Inmate Movement System (PIMS) levels assigned, as well as their release dates, through the grievance process.

In addition, inmates file complaints regarding services provided in the special housing unit. Examples of these are: feedup procedures, commissary, library book exchange, staff rounds, mail delivery and pickup issues, haircuts, laundry and law library services.

SUB-CODES

In past years, sub-codes have been created to monitor specific types of grievances. The codes are 22.1, HIPAA; Code 23.1, Smoke Free Policy; Code 25.1, Strip Search; Code 25.2, Strip Frisk; and Code 25.3, Pat Frisk (Female Inmates).

The 22.1 HIPAA Code was established to monitor grievances concerning the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA). There were 101 grievances in this category in 2010, as compared to the 107 in 2009.

The 23.1 Smoke Free Policy Code was established in 1999 to monitor grievances filed as result of the department's initiative in the promulgation of a Smoke Free Policy in all facilities. The department's plan included a two year implementation program to be completed on January 1, 2001. There were 19 grievances in this category in 2010, as compared to the 41 in 2009.

The 25.1 Strip Search Code and 25.2 Strip Frisk Code were established in 1994 to monitor strip search and strip frisk grievances. There were 14 grievances in the combined sub-codes 25.1 and 25.2 in 2010, compared to the 20 in 2009.

The 25.3 Pat Frisk (Female Inmates) Code was established in 2000 to monitor grievances filed by female inmates in regard to pat frisks. There were 3 grievances filed in 2010 in this category, compared to the 4 in 2009.

S-BLOCKS AND SPECIAL HOUSING UNIT (SHU) FACILITIES

In 1998, the department opened S-Blocks in nine medium security correctional facilities. As expected, the opening of the new units had an impact on the Inmate Grievance Program. In 2010, there were 1,147 grievances filed by S-Block inmates, a decrease of 182 from the 1,329 filed during the same period in 2009. It is noted that the Marcy, CF S-Block was closed on November 9, 2007 and converted to an OMH unit.

In 1991 Southport, CF opened its SHU, and in August 1999 a second SHU was opened at Upstate, CF. While inmates at Southport, CF are in single cells, inmates at Upstate, CF are in double cells, the same as S-Blocks.

Southport, CF had 990 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 1,422 in 2009, however, the grievance issues tend to be the same as described in the above five codes with the exception of Code 30, Package Room. It is noted that packages received in SHU are limited to only books, periodicals and legal materials, resulting in fewer grievances and different issues. Upstate, CF had 1,742 grievances filed in 2010, an increase from the 1,673 in 2009.

The issues consistently involve the inmates' overall dissatisfaction with being transferred from a maximum security facility in keeplock status and placed in a special housing unit. The

transfer results in them no longer having certain privileges afforded an inmate in keeplock status, such as personal property and unlimited visits, and raises double celling concerns such as privacy. Issues unique to 'S' Blocks include the PIMS (Progressive Inmate Movement System) levels and extra privileges allowed on the different levels.

CENTRAL OFFICE REVIEW COMMITTEE (CORC)

The Central Office Review Committee (CORC) is the final appellate level of the Inmate Grievance Program. The CORC consists of the Deputy Commissioner and Counsel, Deputy Commissioner for Correctional Facilities, Deputy Commissioner for Program Services, Deputy Commissioner for Administrative Services and the Deputy Commissioner and Chief Medical Officer, or their designees expressly authorized to act for them. A representative of the Office of Diversity Management attends CORC hearings and has input on grievances alleging discrimination, but does not vote. The CORC functions on behalf of the Commissioner and under his authority. CORC decisions have the effect of directives.

The CORC addressed 5,757 grievance appeals in 2010, 33% of the total filed in the period. This is a decrease of 1,017, or 15%, from 2009 when 6,774 grievance appeals were addressed. The CORC addressed 7,512 grievances in 2008; 8,005 grievances in 2007; 7,056 grievance appeals in 2006; 7,880 grievance appeals in 2005; 7,564 in 2004; 7,108 in 2003; 6,115 in 2002; and 5,541 in 2001. Between 2001 and 2007 the CORC has realized an increase of 2,464 grievance appeals, however, since 2007 the CORC has realized a decrease of 2,248 grievance appeals for this six-month period.

The Prison Litigation Reform Act (PLRA) of 1995, which amended 42 U.S.C. Section 1997e(a), requires that inmates must exhaust available administrative remedies before litigating prison conditions. This has been a major factor in the increase in grievance appeals. In addition, there have been two United States Supreme Court decisions that have been a catalyst in this increase. On May 29, 2001, the Court decided in *Booth v. Churner* that even if the administrative remedy does not provide monetary damages, it is still an available remedy. Subsequently on February 26, 2002, the Court in *Porter v. Nussle* decided that exhaustion is required in every situation, regardless of the nature of the inmate's underlying claim.

ONEIDA HUB

Camp Georgetown Correctional Facility

There were 17 grievances filed in 2010, an increase from the 5 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 3 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 0 last year. Grievances concerned medical treatment, a cane, and medications.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 8 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 3 last year. Grievances alleged abuse of authority, verbal threats, verbal harassment, and retaliation from a prior grievance.

Hale Creek Correctional Facility

There were 29 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 31 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 10 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 13 last year. Grievances concerned requests for outside consultations, proper medical care, changes in treatment after transfer, and medications.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 10 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 13 last year. Grievances alleged threats, harassment, and abuse of authority.

Marcy Correctional Facility

There were 448 grievances filed in 2010, an increase from the 235 last year. The opening of the 100 bed Regional Mental Health Unit (RMHU) impacted grievances slightly, however, the increase was distributed fairly equally among grievance codes and general population.

Code 22, Medical, had 132 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 65 last year. Grievances concerned medical treatment, medications, permits, medical restrictions, eyeglasses, hearing aids, prescription footwear, and RMHU medical procedures.

Code 23, Housing - Internal Block Affairs, had 18 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 9 last year. Grievances concerned clear shower curtains, TV and light policy, RMHU cell cleaning, RMHU haircuts, RMHU cell temperatures, and the use of informational reports in the RMHU.

Code 31, Rules & Regulations, had 17 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 4 last year. Grievances concerned cube compliance, RMHU cell items, RMHU level III personal clothing, and housing procedures.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 55 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 46 last year. Grievances alleged harassment, threats, inappropriate language, excessive force, false reports, and denial of meals.

Mid-State Correctional Facility

There were 153 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 254 last year.

Code 6, Guidance Unit/Counseling, had 11 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 13 last year. Grievances concerned the Sex Offender Counseling & Treatment Program (SOCTP), area of preference transfers, and recommendations for Aggression Replacement Training (ART) and Alcohol & Substance Abuse Treatment (ASAT).

Code 22, Medical, had 45 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 75 last year. Grievances concerned medical treatment, quality of care, medications, delays in medical care, and outside consultations.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 34 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 42 last year. Grievances alleged verbal abuse, threats, profanity, racial comments, physical abuse and retaliation.

Mohawk Correctional Facility

There were 89 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 170 last year. There were 27 grievances filed from Walsh RMU in 2010, a decrease from the 67 last year. The decrease in overall grievances is credited to increased efforts by staff to resolve issues.

Code 22, Medical, had 17 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 42 last year. Grievances concerned medical care, medications, second opinions, specialist requests, bottom bunk permits, and program limitations.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 42 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 51 last year. Grievances alleged verbal threats, harassment, retaliation, discrimination, false misbehavior reports, profanity, improper searches, and sexual harassment.

Oneida Correctional Facility

There were 140 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 144 last year.

Code 19, General Library, had 12 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 0 last year. Grievances concerned removal of the library drop boxes and restitution for missing books.

Code 22, Medical, had 18 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 31 last year. Grievances concerned medical treatment, specialists, medications, orthopedic boots, surgery, reasonable accommodations, medical permits, work restrictions, and an MRI.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 24 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 27 last year. Grievances alleged assault, retaliation, verbal abuse, threats, false misbehavior reports, racial slurs and denial of sick call.

Camp Pharsalia Correctional Facility

There were 0 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 14 last year. The camp was closed to inmates effective May 22, 2009.

Summit Shock Incarceration Correctional Facility

There were 4 grievances filed in 2010, an increase from the 1 last year.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 4 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 1 last year. All of these grievances alleged harassment while being escorted to meals.

WATERTOWN HUB

Cape Vincent Correctional Facility

There were 123 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 137 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 13 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 19 last year. Grievances concerned quality of care, delays in care, outside consultation requests and medications.

Code 37, Mess Hall, had 20 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 7 last year. Grievances concerned portions and food quality. It is noted that one inmate filed 10 grievances in this code.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 31 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 36 last year. Grievances alleged threats, physical and verbal abuse, and retaliation.

Gouverneur Correctional Facility

There were 275 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 350 last year. There were 116 S-Block grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 128 last year.

Code 16, Religion, had 5 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 12 last year. Grievances concerned smudging, places to worship, and call outs.

Code 22, Medical, had 46 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 70 last year. Grievances concerned quality of care, delays in care, requests for specialist consultations, medication, and access to sick call.

Code 28, Tier III Policy and Procedure, had 4 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 12 last year. Grievances concerned overdue hearings, false misbehavior reports, and violations of hearing procedures.

Code 30, Package Room, had 11 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 22 last year. Grievances concerned compliance with Directive #4911, disallowed items, foil and peel and seal tops, and disposal options.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 54 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 51 last year. Grievances alleged verbal harassment, retaliation, discrimination, and threats.

Ogdensburg Correctional Facility

There were 10 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 55 last year. There is no reason noted for the decrease.

Code 22, Medical, had 3 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 11 last year. Grievances concerned requests for care, medications and denial of outside consultations.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 1 grievance in 2010, a decrease from the 15 last year. This grievance alleged physical abuse.

Riverview Correctional Facility

There were 116 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 125 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 13 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 25 last year. Grievances concerned quality of care, special requests, medication and outside consultations.

Code 30, Package Room, had 11 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 10 last year. Grievances concerned disallowed items, delays in issuing packages, missing or destroyed items, and shipping costs.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 24 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 15 last year. Grievances alleged verbal abuse, physical abuse, threats, and racial slurs.

Watertown Correctional Facility

There were 40 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 67 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 13 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 10 last year. Grievances concerned special diets, delayed care, requests for outside consults and medication.

Code 30, Package Room, had 2 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 12 last year. Grievances concerned disallowed items.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 12 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 10 last year. Grievances alleged physical abuse, threats, and verbal abuse.

CLINTON HUB

Adirondack Correctional Facility

There were 39 grievances filed in 2010, an increase from the 28 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 11 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 7 last year. Grievances concerned quality of care, delays in care, medical procedures, medication, and special requests.

Code 30, Package Room, had 2 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 0 last year. Grievances concerned the denial of markers and items sealed with foil or peel tops.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 6 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 10 last year. Grievances alleged verbal abuse and physical abuse.

Altona Correctional Facility

There were 56 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 106 last year. It is noted that 69 grievances were filed in 2008, 59 in 2007, and 64 in 2006.

Code 22, Medical, had 9 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 14 last year. Grievances concerned medication, specialist requests, single cells, medical feed-in, and medical confidentiality.

Code 31, Rules & Regulations, had 4 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 1 last year. Grievances concerned the dress code, the amount of time to eat in the mess hall, an updated copy of the Standards of Inmate Behavior rule book, and the posting of memoranda in the housing units.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 13 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 19 last year. Grievances alleged racial slurs, threats, verbal abuse, and sexual harassment.

Bare Hill Correctional Facility

There were 409 grievances filed in 2010, an increase from the 368 last year.

Code 21, Dental, had 24 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 13 last year. Grievances concerned fillings, partials, extractions, delays in care, and requests for a different dentist. The increase in grievances is attributed to dental staff not being able to see as many inmates, causing a longer wait time for dental treatment. There was an average of 477 inmates seen per quarter in 2010, a decrease from the 608 inmates seen per quarter in 2009.

Code 22, Medical, had 74 grievances in 2010, the same as last year. Grievances concerned delays in care, medical procedures, medication and denial of specialist requests.

Code 30, Package Room, had 29 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 15 last year. Grievances concerned the revision in Directive #4911, staff refusing to pick up damaged packages from the post office, denial of a Sergeant's review, reimbursement for postage, and package room records. The increase in grievances filed is attributed to the 3/24/10 and 6/17/10 revisions of Directive #4911 regarding the packaging of food items.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 141 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 140 last year. Grievances alleged physical abuse, racial slurs, threats, and verbal abuse.

Camp Gabriels Correctional Facility

There were 0 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 3 last year. It is noted that the facility closed in June 2009.

Chateaugay Correctional Facility

There were 2 grievances filed in 2010, the same as last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 1 grievance in 2010, an increase from the 0 last year. This grievance concerned a vaccination.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 1 grievance in 2010, the same as last year. This grievance alleged harassment.

Clinton Correctional Facility

There were 433 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 779 last year. It is noted that there were 467 non-calendared contacts in 2010, an increase from the 83 last year. The increase in non-calendared contacts is attributed to the new IGRC Sergeant, who is very proactive in resolving grievances before they are filed.

Code 3, Correspondence, had 13 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 41 last year. Grievances concerned the opening of privileged correspondence, missing letters, confiscated mail, inadequate postage, and denial of magazines, books and photos. The decrease is attributed to a Senior Mail and Supply Clerk and a Clerk being hired in 2010; prior to this, inexperienced staff from other areas were used to fill the vacancies.

Code 22, Medical, had 141 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 156 last year. Grievances concerned quality of care, delays in care, medical procedures, medication, and specialist requests.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 56 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 117 last year. Grievances alleged threats, racial remarks, harassment, discrimination, staff incompetency, and physical and verbal abuse. No reason for the decrease is noted, other than the overall decrease in grievances facility wide.

Clinton Annex Correctional Facility

There were 128 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 186 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 26 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 33 last year. Grievances concerned quality of care, delays in care, medication, medical procedures, reasonable accommodations, and specialist requests for x-rays, an MRI, and medical boots.

Code 40, Law Library, had 12 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 3 last year. Grievances concerned the denial of call outs, keep lock services, missing books, and a broken typewriter. The increase is attributed to the lack of steady experienced staff in the Law Library.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 33 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 50 last year. Grievances alleged physical abuse, threats, and verbal abuse.

Franklin Correctional Facility

There were 190 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 245 last year.

Code 21, Dental, had 8 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 20 last year. Grievances concerned delays in seeing the dentist, quality of care and emergency care. It is noted that a second dentist was hired this year.

Code 22, Medical, had 37 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 59 last year. Grievances concerned prescriptions, quality of care, delays in seeing the facility doctor, and sick call issues.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 63 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 75 last year. Grievances alleged threats, racial remarks, and physical and verbal abuse.

Lyon Mountain Correctional Facility

There were 5 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 8 last year.

Code 35, Commissary, had 2 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 0 last year. Grievances concerned can returns and outdated items.

Upstate Correctional Facility

There were 1,769 grievances filed in 2010, an increase from the 1,673 last year.

Code 3, Correspondence, had 80 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 57 last year. Grievances concerned mail delays, mail being held, mail being opened and mail being returned due to postage, missing items, denial of return receipt service, photographs, lost magazines and letters, postage costs, and denial of certified and privileged correspondence. It is noted that 1 inmate filed 11 of these grievances.

Code 20, ASAT, had 6 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 0 last year. Grievances concerned being placed on a waiting list, program removal, and an ASAT need. It is noted that inmates in SHU can now enroll in ASAT.

Code 22, Medical, had 509 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 396 last year. Grievances concerned quality of care, delays in care, outside consultations, amount of time to see an outside specialist, medical procedures, medications and special requests. The increase is attributed to the doctor and physician's assistant vacancies this year.

Code 24, Special Housing Units, had 174 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 113 last year. Grievances concerned block procedures, denial of state issued items, missing property, PIMS level, hygiene items, paper supplies, disbursement forms, the shower and exercise schedule, bottom bunk requests, and problems with the wall jack. It is noted that there were 230 grievances filed in 2007 and 194 filed in 2006.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 432 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 533 last year. Grievances alleged harassment, cell searches, false misbehavior reports, physical abuse, racial slurs and threats.

SULLIVAN HUB

Eastern Correctional Facility

There were 247 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 278 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 33 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 52 last year. Grievances concerned second opinions, examinations, medical records, surgery, outside specialty recommendations, medications, hearing aids, and medical permits. The decrease in grievances is attributed to the hiring of a third physician.

Code 30, Package Room, had 28 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 15 last year. Grievances concerned hermetic seals, hollow sneakers, cassette tapes, clippers, destroyed or lost packages, sergeant's review, and notification of package mailing.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 28 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 37 last year. Grievances alleged sexual harassment, unprofessional pat frisks, assault, threats, hostility, abusive language, false misbehavior reports, and false statements by staff.

Mid-Orange Correctional Facility

There were 80 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 116 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 35 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 39 last year. Grievances concerned medications, requests to see specialists, proper medical care, MRI's, orthopedic boots, braces, permits, eyeglasses, blood pressure testing, doctor's appointments, contact lenses, follow up appointments, examinations, CT scans, a colonoscopy, medical restrictions, and sick call procedures.

Code 30, Package Room, had 7 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 6 last year. Grievances concerned package weight, hobby craft items, bag gloves, headphones, sneakers, postage, and package room procedures.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 6 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 21 last year. Grievances alleged verbal abuse, threats, retaliation, unprofessional conduct and unfair treatment. It is noted that the number of staff conduct grievances in 2009 was unusually high; there were 7 grievances in 2008 and 9 grievances in 2007. As such, the current number is considered to be more representative.

Otisville Correctional Facility

There were 114 grievances filed in 2010, an increase from the 62 last year. The increase was caused by the sudden IGP Supervisor vacancy, which resulted in less grievances being informally resolved.

Code 23, Housing-Internal Block Affairs, had 10 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 7 last year. Grievances concerned searches using dirty gloves, bottom and top bunks, cube inspections, fan placement, smoke breaks, housing unit moves and staff allegedly kicking the bed.

Code 25, Search & Seizure/Frisks/Contraband, had 10 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 2 last year. Grievances concerned enforcement of the new property limit policy.

Code 30, Package Room, had 9 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 4 last year. Grievances concerned adapters, sneakers, electric shavers, snack packs, jalapeno chips, missing items, and destroyed property.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 16 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 4 last year. Grievances alleged threats, verbal abuse, intimidation, improper investigations, unauthorized searches and retaliation.

Shawangunk Correctional Facility

There were 428 grievances filed in 2010, an increase from the 418 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 88 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 61 last year. Grievances concerned referrals for specialty care, medications, MRI's, wheelchair issues, and alleged violations of medical confidentiality. One inmate filed 24 of the 88 grievances.

Code 30, Package Room, had 26 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 21 last year. Grievances concerned sneakers, boots, Kool Aid and Tang packaging, a magnifying glass, plastic binder and missing items.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 26 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 39 last year. Grievances alleged verbal harassment, sexual harassment, assault, racial slurs, religious discrimination and retaliation.

Sullivan Correctional Facility

There were 320 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 414 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 75 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 88 last year. Grievances concerned medications, diagnoses, treatment, MRI's, hearing impairment, mobility guides, and referrals to specialists.

Code 31, Rules & Regulations, had 24 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 7 last year. Grievances concerned urinalysis procedures, ION scanning testing, Limited Time Credit Allowance (LCTA), cuffing procedures in the frisk area, and an alleged work injury.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 44 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 60 last year. Grievances alleged harassment, racial discrimination, misconduct by medical staff, threats, improper search and retaliatory disposal of property.

Ulster Correctional Facility

There were 52 grievances filed in 2010, an increase from the 18 last year. It is noted that the IGP Supervisor retired in May 2010 and that grievances increased in April and May 2010.

Code 22, Medical, had 6 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 3 last year. Grievances concerned nicotine patches, treatment, proper care, examinations, medical transfers, and medications.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 13 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 5 last year. Grievances alleged harassment, physical abuse, profanity, medical care, property processing, coercion, and denial of the Shock Program.

Wallkill Correctional Facility

There were 123 grievances filed in 2010, an increase from the 63 last year. No reason is noted for the increase, however, the number of grievances filed in 2010 is consistent with the 140 filed for the same period in 2008.

Code 22, Medical, had 24 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 14 last year. Grievances concerned special tests, proper medical care, bottom bunks, requests to see a doctor, and referrals to specialty care.

Code 23, Housing-Internal Block Affairs, had 17 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 5 last year. Grievances concerned single cells, cell searches, TV volume, and dorm policy.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 15 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 9 last year. Grievances alleged verbal harassment, threats, retaliation, and unprofessional behavior. These grievances continue to stem from misbehavior reports.

Woodbourne Correctional Facility

There were 124 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 163 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 25 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 48 last year. Grievances concerned treatment, records, outside hospital procedures, and referrals to specialists.

Code 30, Package Room, had 16 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 9 last year. Grievances concerned hermetic seals, denied items, postage costs, and inconsistency between facilities regarding allowable items.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 16 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 15 last year. Grievances alleged harassment, retaliation, intimidation, assault, and sexual abuse.

GREEN HAVEN HUB

Beacon Correctional Facility

There were 25 grievances filed in 2010, an increase from the 21 last year

Code 22, Medical, had 2 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 3 last year. Grievances concerned the professionalism of medical staff.

Code 23, Housing-Internal Block Affairs, had 0 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 6 last year.

Code 37, Mess Hall, had 1 grievance in 2010, a decrease from the 3 last year. This grievance alleged improperly prepared food.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 9 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 4 last year. Grievances alleged verbal abuse and unprofessional conduct.

Bedford Hills Correctional Facility

There were 214 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 243 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 29 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 39 last year. Grievances concerned requests for medical attention, medication, managed care, choice of providers, specialist consultations, and timely medical care. The decrease can be attributed to the assignment of one Registered Nurse to respond to all letters received by medical staff.

Code 24, Special Housing Units, had 23 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 1 last year. Grievances concerned showers, property, exercise, restraint procedures, and mail distribution. It is noted that 3 inmates filed 21 of these grievances.

Code 31, Rules and Regulations, had 35 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 27 last year. Grievances concerned failure to follow policy and procedures, alternative meal concerns, and shower issues.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 23 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 25 last year. Grievances alleged profanity, unprofessional conduct, threats, discrimination, harassment, and mental abuse.

Downstate Correctional Facility (Reception)

There were 125 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 259 last year. The decrease is attributed to Court inmates being returned to their owning facilities much faster than previously.

Code 22, Medical, had 26 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 28 last year. Grievances concerned improper treatment, medication, eyeglasses, and TB testing.

Code 23, Housing- Internal Block Affairs, had 10 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 25 last year. Grievances concerned mail and supply distribution, showers, and missed call outs.

Code 40, Law Library, had 1 grievance in 2010, a decrease from the 9 last year. This grievance concerned not receiving the requested material.

Code 43, Mandatory Court Surcharge, had 9 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 14 last year. Grievances concerned the collection of DNA fees.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 19 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 30 last year. Grievances alleged confiscation of religious items, harassment, and assault.

Downstate Correctional Facility (Cadre)

There were 36 grievances filed in 2010, an increase from the 30 last year.

Code 3, Correspondence, had 4 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 0 last year. Grievances concerned the availability of stamps in the commissary and delayed mail.

Code 22, Medical, had 3 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 6 last year. Grievances concerned requests for specialty care, medication, and treatment.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 6 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 4 last year. Grievances alleged denial of recreation, harassment, and retaliation.

Fishkill Correctional Facility

There were 420 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 706 last year. There were 113 grievances filed from S-Block, a decrease from the 310 last year. The decrease in general population grievances is attributed to improved staff communication and responses, and having all Nurse Administrator positions filled. The decrease in S-Block grievances is being attributed to the IGRC Sergeant, Block Sergeant, and IGP Supervisor resolving more issues by making additional rounds each week.

Code 21, Dental, had 13 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 21 last year. Grievances concerned lack of treatment, request for cleanings, and delayed treatment.

Code 22, Medical, had 70 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 138 last year. Grievances concerned medication, specialty care, provider appointments, and treatment.

Code 24, Special Housing Units, had 45 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 64 last year. Grievances concerned stamp/commissary buys, missing property, food, and mail issues.

Code 30, Package Room, had 39 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 35 last year. Grievances concerned denied items, missing items, and outgoing packages.

Code 37, Mess Hall, had 12 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 23 last year. Grievances concerned improper food portions, substitutions, serving temperatures, and not following the menu. The decrease can be attributed to continued monitoring of food sent out to the satellite areas such as S-Block and SHU.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 80 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 199 last year. Grievances alleged threats, assault, discrimination, retaliation, and abusive language.

Green Haven Correctional Facility

There were 1,123 grievances filed in 2010, an increase from the 1,011 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 174 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 180 last year. Grievances concerned medication, treatment, specialty care, managed care (MRI, podiatry, PT), provider appointments, and a change of provider.

Code 23, Housing-Internal Block Affairs, had 167 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 131 last year. Grievances concerned access to call outs, denial of recreation, and meals.

Code 30, Package Room, had 114 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 121 last year. Grievances concerned disallowed items, returned packages, and the processing of packages.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 81 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 84 last year. Grievances alleged harassment, threats, assault, and retaliation.

Taconic Correctional Facility

There were 52 grievances filed in 2010, the same as last year.

Code 3, Correspondence, had 5 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 0 last year. Grievances concerned missing mail and delayed delivery of mail.

Code 22, Medical, had 10 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 8 last year. Grievances concerned access to medical treatment, quality of care, and Reasonable Accommodations.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 11 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 21 last year. Grievances alleged verbal harassment, improper restraints, and denial of sanitary napkins.

GREAT MEADOW HUB

Coxsackie Correctional Facility

There were 325 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 459 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 52 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 75 last year. Grievances concerned requests for a cane, eyeglasses, medical boots, release from RMU, surgery, doctor appointments, back support, and denial of medical services.

Code 30, Package Room, had 23 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 7 last year. Grievances concerned missing items from packages, denied items, spoiled items, returned items, legal mail issue, and a disallowed watch and correction ribbons.

Code 37, Mess Hall, had 15 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 24 last year. Grievances concerned requests for back pay and wage increases, cold food, unsanitary food trays, and problems with RMU and keeplock meals, kosher food and Passover meals.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 118 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 148 last year. Grievances alleged denial of recreation, showers, phones and meals, allegations of assault and excessive use of force, and unprofessional conduct.

Great Meadow Correctional Facility

There were 865 grievances filed in 2010, an increase from the 849 last year.

Code 21, Dental, had 10 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 59 last year. Grievances concerned requests for a cleaning, delays in denture fabrication and routine treatment. The decrease can be attributed to the hiring of a dentist.

Code 22, Medical, had 146 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 189 last year. Grievances concerned medical appointments, medication refills, and receipt of medical permits.

Code 24, Special Housing Units, had 58 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 39 last year. Grievances concerned denial of recreation, supplies, showers, and mail distribution.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 127 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 114 last year. Grievances alleged false misbehavior reports, harassment, and improper pat frisks.

Greene Correctional Facility

There were 129 grievances filed in 2010, an increase from the 128 last year. There were 70 grievances filed from S-Block, an increase from the 46 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 25 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 24 last year. Grievances concerned denial of care, delayed treatment, medication, and quality of care.

Code 24, Special Housing Units, had 20 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 3 last year. Grievances concerned supplies, and the conduct of area staff.

Code 30, Package Room, had 4 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 7 last year. Grievances concerned missing items, and misplaced packages.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 31 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 40 last year. Grievances alleged threats, physical abuse, and verbal abuse.

Hudson Correctional Facility

There were 11 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 13 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 0 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 1 last year.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 8 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 9 last year. Grievances alleged unprofessional conduct, verbal abuse, and threats.

Moriah Shock Incarceration Correctional Facility

There were 0 grievances filed in 2010, the same as last year.

Mt. McGregor Correctional Facility (Medium)

There were 43 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 48 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 6 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 2 last year. Grievances concerned treatment, medication, prescription policy, and a sneaker pass.

Code 30, Package Room, had 5 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 2 last year. Grievances concerned disposal of disallowed items, the negative vendor's list, and two-toned clothing.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 10 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 21 last year. Grievances alleged verbal harassment, false misbehavior reports, threats, verbal abuse, and theft of commissary items.

Washington Correctional Facility

There were 34 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 38 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 6 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 11 last year. Grievances concerned quality of treatment, and specialist consultation requests.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 4 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 11 last year. Grievances alleged racial profiling, harassment, and verbal abuse.

ELMIRA HUB

Auburn Correctional Facility

There were 1,133 grievances filed in 2010, an increase from the 898 last year.

Code 3, Correspondence, had 32 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 41 last year. Grievances concerned nude photographs, untimely processing of incoming mail, and the number of printed pages allowed.

Code 22, Medical, had 192 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 121 last year. Grievances concerned quality of care, sick call, and requests to see a specialist.

Code 29, Inmate Personal Property, had 62 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 97 last year. Grievances concerned property lost or damaged during transfers, and confiscation of radios.

Code 30, Package Room, had 61 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 37 last year. Grievances concerned missing items and denial of items.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 250 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 126 last year. Grievances alleged retaliation, threats, verbal abuse, and denial of privileges.

Butler Correctional Facility (Minimum)

There were 13 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 26 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 3 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 1 last year. Grievances concerned requests for medication and specialty care appointments.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 5 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 12 last year. Grievances alleged harassment and verbal abuse.

Butler Correctional Facility (ASACTC)

There were 19 grievances filed in 2010, an increase from the 17 last year.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 9 grievances in 2010, the same as last year. Grievances alleged verbal abuse, racial discrimination and physical abuse.

Cayuga Correctional Facility

There were 111 grievances filed in 2010, an increase from the 93 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 16 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 14 last year. Grievances concerned quality of care, and medications.

Code 24, Special Housing Units, had 11 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 9 last year. Grievances concerned legal envelopes, and commissary items being placed in personal property.

Code 30, Package Room, had 8 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 3 last year. Grievances concerned disallowed clothing and an unprocessed package.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 24 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 20 last year. Grievances alleged harassment and racial slurs.

Elmira Correctional Facility

There were 650 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 654 last year.

Code 3, Correspondence, had 20 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 41 last year. Grievances concerned returned mail and postage.

Code 22, Medical, had 110 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 94 last year. Grievances concerned access to sick call, doctor call outs, inadequate care, and medication.

Code 23, Housing-Internal Block Affairs, had 55 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 58 last year. Grievances concerned call outs, cell searches, and maintenance issues.

Code 36, Inmate Accounts, had 39 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 41 last year. Grievances concerned delays in returning disbursement forms, delays in money being placed in accounts, and inmate organizations not receiving funds in a timely manner.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 109 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 84 last year. Grievances alleged retaliation, verbal abuse, and assault.

Five Points Correctional Facility

There were 856 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 870 last year.

Code 1, Program Committee, had 55 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 42 last year. Grievances concerned back pay, raises, and pay rates for inmates who refuse recommended programs, and changes in programs.

Code 22, Medical, had 100 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 131 last year. Grievances concerned change of provider, medication, specialist appointments, denial of/delayed treatment, and staff demeanor.

Code 24, Special Housing Units, had 46 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 36 last year. Grievances concerned heat, commissary buys, cell shields, and supplies.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 120 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 85 last year. Grievances alleged retaliation, harassment, assault, destructive cell searches, and use of racial slurs.

Monterey Shock Incarceration Correctional Facility

There were 0 grievances filed in 2010, the same as last year.

Southport Correctional Facility

There were 990 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 1,422 last year. There is no reason noted for the decrease.

Code 3, Correspondence, had 117 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 118 last year. Grievances concerned delivery of magazines and newspapers, returned mail, postcards, denial of nude photographs, and mail sent to the wrong inmate.

Code 5, Visiting, had 7 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 50 last year. Grievances concerned terminated visits, being moved to the non contact area, and denial of visitors. It is noted that grievances increased in 2009 when a more secure visiting room was opened on 2/14/09, decreasing the number of available contact visiting seats. The number of grievances this year is consistent with the 12 filed in 2006, 7 filed in 2007 and 5 filed 2008.

Code 22, Medical, had 218 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 361 last year. Grievances concerned the Patients Bill of Rights, prescriptions, quality of care, wanting to see a doctor or a specialist, and pain medication. It is noted that the IGP Supervisor has implemented weekly meetings with the Nurse Administrator to discuss issues presented to her during IGP rounds in SHU. This direct approach has resulted in the decrease of grievances.

Code 23, Housing-Internal Block Affairs, had 64 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 119 last year. Grievances concerned fans, distribution of mail, supplies, inoperable vents, tight restraints, and access to showers and exercise.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 174 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 232 last year. Grievances alleged assault, retaliation, destroyed mail, false misbehavior reports, and denial of entitlements.

Willard Drug Treatment Campus

There were 0 grievances filed in 2010, the same as last year.

NEW YORK CITY HUB

Arthur Kill Correctional Facility

There were 167 grievances filed in 2010, an increase from the 156 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 49 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 67 last year. Grievances concerned quality of care, delays in care, medical procedures, medication, and requests for eye care, footwear, bottom bunk permits, surgery, special diets, and physical therapy. It is noted that a new Doctor and Nurse Administrator were hired in 2010.

Code 23, Housing- Internal Block Affairs, had 5 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 4 last year. Grievances concerned timely issuance of supplies, cleaning the housing unit, and dorm policy.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 34 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 32 last year. Grievances alleged harassment, threats, verbal abuse, physical abuse, and racial slurs.

Bayview Correctional Facility

There were 45 grievances filed in 2010, an increase from the 32 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 10 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 5 last year. Grievances concerned disease control, denial of emergency medical treatment, inadequate medical attention, delays in care, medication, family notification, and requests to see the doctor or specialist.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 16 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 14 last year. Grievances alleged harassment, physical abuse, retaliation, negligence, verbal abuse, lack of professionalism and threats.

Edgecombe Correctional Facility

There were 0 grievances filed in 2010, the same as last year.

Fulton Correctional Facility

There were 2 grievances filed in 2010, the same as last year.

Code 37, Messhall, had 1 grievance in 2010, the same as last year. Grievances concerned the securing of mess hall workers and staff language.

Lincoln Correctional Facility

There were 0 grievances filed in 2010, the same as last year.

Queensboro Correctional Facility

There were 26 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 29 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 1 grievance in 2010, a decrease from the 2 last year. This grievance concerned medical treatment.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 13 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 12 last year. Grievances alleged retaliation, harassment, abuse of authority, threats, medical indifference, and verbal and physical abuse.

Sing Sing Correctional Facility

There were 799 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 863 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 163 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 110 last year. Grievances concerned lack of care, quality of care, denial of medical records, sick call slips, shower and bed rest passes, outside trips, medication, and requests to see a specialist or doctor.

Code 23, Housing-Internal Block Affairs, had 66 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 90 last year. Grievances concerned requests to change housing units, double bunking, mail delivery, cell equipment, escorts, access to call outs, recreation, and showers.

Code 30, Package Room, had 37 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 94 last year. Grievances concerned the cost of postage, delays in processing packages, lost or stolen items, and denial of poster board paper, food, hot peppers, key board and shea butter.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 95 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 97 last year. Grievances alleged harassment, retaliation, racial remarks, threats, assault, sexual discrimination, and physical and verbal abuse.

WENDE HUB

Albion Correctional Facility

There were 128 grievances filed in 2010, an increase from the 96 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 23 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 12 last year. Grievances concerned access to physicians, medication, orthotics, surgical intervention, and specialty consultations.

Code 30, Package Room, had 20 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 11 last year. Grievances concerned the denial of items such as earrings, Khimars, container sizes, toiletries, printed waistbands on underwear, re-sealable food items, scarves, shorts, a package from another correctional facility, and delays in processing packages.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 34 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 37 last year. Grievances alleged verbal and sexual harassment, profanity, physical abuse and threats.

Attica Correctional Facility

There were 694 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 842 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 142 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 181 last year. Grievances concerned changes in medications, denial of diagnostic testing, specialist consultations and improper care.

Code 24, Special Housing Units, had 54 grievances in 2010, the same as last year. Grievances concerned many aspects of the Specialized Treatment Program (STP), the provision of supplies and services, the housing of mental health inmates on the unit and allegations of staff misconduct.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 68 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 103 last year. Grievances alleged verbal harassment, assault, threats, racial slurs and retaliation.

Buffalo Correctional Facility

There was 1 grievance filed in 2010, the same as last year.

Code 6, Guidance Unit / Counseling, had 1 grievance in 2010, an increase from the 0 last year. This grievance concerned assessment of programs, and it was informally resolved at the facility level.

Collins Correctional Facility

There were 326 grievances filed in 2010, an increase from the 321 last year. There were 235 S-Block grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 240 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 67 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 68 last year. Grievances concerned quality of care, delay in care, medical procedures, medication and requests for outside consultations.

Code 24, Special Housing Units, had 22 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 39 last year. Grievances concerned double cell criteria, cell assignments, stolen property, interaction with staff, supplies, and showers.

Code 44, Inmate Grievance Program, had 12 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 33 last year. Grievances concerned investigations, compliance with Directive #4040, consolidations, and dissatisfaction with the IGP Supervisor. It is noted that one inmate filed 7 grievances in this code.

Gowanda Correctional Facility

There were 121 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 165 last year. The decrease is attributed to a decrease in the facility population from 1,640 to 1,550.

Code 3, Correspondence, had 1 grievance in 2010, a decrease from the 8 last year. This grievance concerned an unsigned return receipt.

Code 23, Housing - Internal Block Affairs, had 0 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 10 last year.

Code 30, Package Room, had 5 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 14 last year. Grievances concerned disallowed items, UPS shipping fees, missing items, and a request for reimbursement.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 38 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 37 last year. Grievances alleged threats, verbal abuse, discrimination, retaliation, sexual harassment, and physical abuse.

Groveland Correctional Facility

There were 156 grievances filed in 2010, an increase from the 107 last year. It is noted that the IGP Supervisor has been out on long term medical leave since April. The office is being covered by the Livingston Correctional Facility IGP Supervisor with the assistance of two facility staff members.

Code 22, Medical, had 44 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 24 last year. Grievances concerned medication, diets, permits, medical distribution times, access to physicians, call outs, the transfer of medical records and medications, misdiagnoses, and specialty care appointments.

Code 30, Package Room, had 10 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 4 last year. Grievances concerned disallowed items, two-tone items, beard trimmers, stolen property, and the disposition of disallowed packages.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 29 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 22 last year. Grievances alleged threats, retaliation, physical and verbal abuse.

Lakeview Correctional Facility

There were 402 grievances filed in 2010, an increase from the 354 last year. There were 397 S-Block grievances filed in 2010, an increase from the 349 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 72 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 56 last year. Grievances concerned sick call in S-Block, medication, specialist consultation requests and quality of care issues. It is noted that one inmate filed 21 grievances in this code.

Code 23, Housing - Internal Block Affairs, had 69 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 68 last year. Grievances concerned supplies, showers and allegations of improper staff actions.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 28 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 20 last year. Grievances alleged unprofessional behavior, verbal and physical abuse, threats, and retaliation.

Livingston Correctional Facility

There were 111 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 163 last year.

Code 20, ASAT, had 11 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 4 last year. Grievances concerned evaluations, removals, and requests for prior credit.

Code 22, Medical, had 18 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 19 last year. Grievances concerned quality of care, medication, medical procedures and requests for outside consultations.

Code 30, Package Room, had 3 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 10 last year. Grievances concerned peel and seal tops, hot peppers, returning disallowed items to visitors, and disposal options.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 11 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 18 last year. Grievances alleged verbal abuse, threats, physical abuse, intimidation, pat frisks and retaliation.

Orleans Correctional Facility

There were 307 grievances filed in 2010, the same as last year. There were 129 S-block grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 150 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 32 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 45 last year. Grievances concerned quality of care, delays in care, medication and requests for specialized consultations.

Code 24, Special Housing Units, had 35 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 27 last year. Grievances concerned property, grooming supplies, fans and lights being left on, supplies, property issue, showers, and cell clean up.

Code 33, Personal Property Claims, had 4 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 14 last year. Grievances concerned missing property.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 34 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 43 last year. Grievances alleged verbal harassment, threats, discrimination, physical abuse and unprofessional conduct.

Rochester Correctional Facility

There were 3 grievances filed in 2010, an increase from the 0 last year.

Code 6, Guidance Unit / Counseling, had 3 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 0 last year. These grievances were informally resolved at the facility level.

Wende Correctional Facility

There were 957 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 975 last year. It is noted that one inmate filed 116 during this reporting period.

Code 22, Medical, had 162 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 159 last year. Grievances concerned quality of care, medical procedures, medication, special permits, and allegations of delayed care.

Code 23, Housing/Internal Block Affairs, had 124 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 154 last year. Grievances concerned denial of recreation, showers, meals, call outs, hair cuts and phone calls.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 116 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 135 last year. Grievances alleged improper staff conduct, retaliation, verbal abuse, threats, assault and discrimination.

Wyoming Correctional Facility

There were 160 grievances filed in 2010, a decrease from the 165 last year.

Code 22, Medical, had 46 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 28 last year. Grievances concerned specialist consultations, medication, and permits.

Code 30, Package Room, had 9 grievances in 2010, a decrease from the 13 last year. Grievances concerned the timeliness and processing of packages, overcharges for postage, and disallowed, missing or damaged items.

Code 49, Staff Conduct, had 41 grievances in 2010, an increase from the 25 last year. Grievances alleged verbal abuse, threats, retaliation, profanity and harassment.
