NEW YORK STATE FELONY PROCESSING: CALENDAR YEAR 2010*

ARRESTS: Statewide, total felony arrests for calendar year 2010 were down 1.8% (or -2,994 arrests) from the 168,084 arrests during 2009 to 165,090 arrests in 2010. This decrease in arrests occurred in New York City, down 3.0% (or -2,951 arrests), and Suburban NYC, down 2.8% (or -559 arrests). Upstate area arrests increased 1.0% (or 516 arrests) more than in 2009.

The ten largest arrest categories for 2009 and 2010 are shown in the table below. Three of these crime categories increased while seven declined. The three largest numeric changes in arrests from the prior year were: Drug and Marijuana Offenses, down 3,310 arrests (or -9.0%), followed by Weapons, down 692 arrests (or -6.5%), and Hindering Prosecution, up 524 arrests or (4.2%).

INDICTMENTS: Statewide, total indictments for 2010 were down 4.9% from 2009 levels (or -2,566 indictments). This decrease in indictments occurred statewide with New York City, which was down 5.9% (or -1,422 cases), and Upstate areas, which were down 5.0% (or -1,044 cases). Suburban New York City had a smaller decrease between 2009 and 2010, down 1.3% (or -100 cases).

Among the indictment categories listed below, four increased while six declined. The largest numeric changes in indictments were: Drug and Marijuana, down 1,207 indictments (or -9.0%), Robbery, down 539 indictments (or -8.6%), and Assault, down 163 indictments (or -3.8%).

DISPOSITIONS: Total State dispositions were down by 4.4% (or -2,257 dispositions) during 2010 as compared to 2009. This decrease in dispositions occurred state wide, with New York City down 3.9% (or -889 dispositions), Suburban New York City down 4.0% (or -292 dispositions), and Upstate areas down 5.1% (or -1,076 dispositions).

Among the disposition categories listed below, three increased, and seven decreased. The three crime categories with the greatest change in the number of dispositions were: Drug and Marijuana Offenses, down 1,313 dispositions (or -9.8%), followed by Robbery, down 280 dispositions (or -5.1%), and Hindering Prosecution, up 206 dispositions (or 17.2%).

CONVICTIONS: Total state convictions for January – December 2010 decreased, down 4.8% from the 2009 levels (or -2,157 convictions). The number of convictions that resulted in a sentence to state prison was down 2.7% to 16,694 compared to 17,150 for the same period in 2009 (or -456 sentences). During 2010, New York City had the highest level of state prison sentences at 43.0% compared to 30.0% for Suburban New York City and 37.4% for Upstate areas.
