Statistical Overview

Year 2011 Releases and Discharges from Incarceration

This document describes the characteristics of offenders released or discharged from incarceration under the custody of the New York State Department of Corrections and Community Supervision during calendar year 2011 (N=27,728). The report concentrates on inmates released from prison into the community for the first time on their current sentence (N=15,118), as opposed to those released after a return to prison for violating conditions of parole or post release supervision. This overview presents information on length of time served in custody according to various legal history criteria such as commitment offense, felony class, category of commitment offense and minimum sentence length. For comparative purposes, there are two tables that show trends in time served in custody across the years 2007 through 2011.

Introduction

In April 2011, the former New York State Department of Correctional Services merged with the former New York State Division of Parole to form the New York State Department of Corrections and Community Supervision (DOCCS). As a result of this merger, this report will, for the first time include information on all Offenders¹ under the jurisdiction of DOCCS who are incarcerated in a Correctional Facility² or a Parole Program Facility³. Incarcerated Offenders⁴ include both Inmates⁵ admitted to a correctional facility as well as Incarcerated Parolees⁶ admitted to DOCCS correctional or parole program facilities.

Offender Releases During Calendar Year 2011: Although the majority of this report focuses on inmates first released from custody to the community during 2011, this introductory section provides some background regarding all offenders released or discharged from DOCCS facilities during 2011. There were a total of 27,728 releases during calendar year 2011 (see Table 1-A). Among the 27,728 releases, 25,327 occurred among inmates and 2,401 occurred among incarcerated parolees. Total inmate releases during 2011 (25,327) include offenders who were participants in either the Alt-90 program at Willard or the Alt-45 program at Edgecombe. Most of the 2,401 incarcerated parolees released during 2011 were released from parole program facilities; while the majority (86%) were releases after successfully completing the program requirements, 14% were released from correctional facilities due to their inability to successfully complete the program at the program site (see Table 1-A). Most inmates (96%) were released from correctional facilities. The inmates released from parole program facilities successfully completed the Alt-90 or Alt 45 program and were released directly from the program. (see pg. iii for a more complete description of the Alt programs).

¹ An offender is defined as a convicted felon under the jurisdiction of DOCCS.

² A Correctional Facility is a traditional prison in which incarcerated offenders are housed.

³ A Parole Program Facility is a facility that houses a specialized treatment program for offenders under community supervision or returned to prison for violating conditions of parole.

⁴ Incarcerated offenders are offenders who are either owned by a correctional facility or a parole program facility.

⁵ An inmate is an incarcerated offender who is not under community supervision.

⁶ An incarcerated parolee is an incarcerated offender who is under community supervision.

During 2011, 91% of releases from DOCCS facilities occurred among inmates, 9% were among incarcerated parolees. Most (87%) of the inmate releases during 2011 were to the community to complete a term of Community Supervision (see Table 1-B). Among these releases, there were 1,708 “Alt” program participants. There were 3,296 inmates released in 2011 who were not placed on Community Supervision. Of these 3,296 inmate releases, 2,664 were released after serving the maximum time on their sentence. Incarcerated parolee releases made up the remaining 9% of the total releases from DOCCS facilities in 2011. Of the incarcerated parolee releases, almost half were Willard PV’s.

Incarcerated Parolees: In addition to the inmate classifications listed, incarcerated parolees are also included in this report. Incarcerated parolees consist of the following three categories: Willard Judicially Sanctioned Parolees⁷, Willard Parole Violators⁸, and Parole Diversion Program Participants⁹. Incarcerated parolees remain under the jurisdiction of Community Supervision for the duration of their participation in the drug treatment program at Willard or Edgecombe. The total number of incarcerated parolee releases in 2011 was 2,401.

Inmate Categories: Previous reports in this series have reported on the number of inmates released from correctional facilities. In an effort to more accurately report on the populations under the jurisdiction of DOCCS, this report now includes releases among inmates participating in the Alternative 90-day drug treatment program (Alt-90) or the Alternative 45-day drug treatment program (Alt-45), as well as releases for incarcerated parolees in parole program facilities such as Willard Drug Treatment Campus or Edgecombe Residential Treatment. The “Alt” participants are considered inmates for the duration of their confinement, and upon successful completion are returned to the Community Supervision caseload. The total number of inmate releases in 2011 was 25,327.

The remainder of this report will be limited to discussion of inmate releases.

⁷ Willard judicially sanctioned parolees were sentenced by the court to the Willard Drug Treatment Campus as an alternative to incarceration in a DOCCS general confinement facility and are participating in the program as incarcerated parolees.

⁸ Willard technical parole violators are technical parole violators who were revoked and restored to community supervision status and are participating in the Willard Alternative Drug Treatment Program as incarcerated parolees.


⁹ There are two types of Parole Diversion Program (PDP) Participants. The first type of PDP participant consists of technical parole violators who had a parole warrant lodged against them and who agree to participate in a 45 day Alternative Drug Treatment Program at the Edgecombe Correctional Facility in lieu of proceeding with a parole revocation hearing. If they successfully complete the program, the parole warrant will be lifted and they will be restored to community supervision status. If they fail to successfully complete the program they will be transferred from the PDP Facility to the county jail where they will await a parole revocation hearing presided over by an ALJ. The second type of PDP participant consists of parolees who their Parole Officer believed were in danger of relapsing because of some specific behavior or environmental condition. These parolees were given a choice of either having a parole warrant lodged against them and proceeding with a parole revocation hearing or having the conditions of their parole administratively modified by their Parole Officer and approved by the Parole Officer’s Supervising Parole Officer. The modified conditions include participation in the PDP. If the parolee successfully completes the PDP they will be returned to community supervision. If they do not successfully complete the PDP a parole warrant will be lodged against them and they will be remanded to a county jail to await a parole revocation hearing. The issuance of the parole warrant for failure to successfully complete the PDP is reviewed by the Quality Control section of the DOCCS Central Office Internal Operations Unit.

Section 1: TYPE OF RELEASE

Of the 25,327 inmate releases in 2011, 8,323 (33%) were released to parole supervision as a result of Parole Board decisions, another 10,901 (43%) were released to parole supervision after reaching a conditional release date, 1,708 (7%) were released after successful participation in the Alt-90 or Alt-45 program, and 2,664 were released with no further supervision as a result of serving time until the maximum expiration of their sentence. There were also 1,099 (4%) released offenders who reached the maximum expiration of their sentence, but were required to have Post-Release Supervision in the community. The sum of these five release types, 24,695, is considered to be the number of releases to the community. Most of these cases, (89%) were released to complete a term of Community Supervision.

(2011 Total Releases, N=25,327)




2011 First Release Demographics

(2011 First Release Population, N=15,118)



Section 2: COMMITMENT OFFENSE BY GENDER

Six percent (932) of first releases were women and 94% (14,186) were men.¹⁰ A larger proportion of men released in 2011 (36%) were committed for violent felonies than women (20%). Conversely, a larger proportion of women released were committed for drug offenses and property offenses (32% and 37%, respectively) than were men (29% and 21%, respectively) (see Figure 2).

¹⁰ In contrast, as of December 31, 2011, only 4% or 2,303 of the 5,090 incarcerated offenders were women.

Of the 15,118 first releases in 2011, 35% were committed for violent felony offenses, 11% for other coercive offenses, 29% for drug offenses, 22% for property and other types of offenses, and 4% as Youthful or Juvenile Offenders (see Table 2).

Section 3: TIME SERVED BY COMMITMENT OFFENSE

The average “total time served” (i.e., state time plus jail time) for first releases in 2011 was 47 months and the median was 31 months. The average “state time only” for these releases was 39 months and the median was 23 months (see Table 3).

TIME SERVED BY SECOND FELONY OFFENDER STATUS

Offenders sentenced as repeat felony offenders generally serve longer prison sentences than those sentenced as first felony offenders. On average, second and persistent¹¹ felony offenders were incarcerated 2 months longer (48 months) than first felony offenders (46 months). Second and persistent violent felons served an average of 20 months more time than first-time violent felons (see Table 4).

TRENDS IN TIME SERVED (2007-2011)

Among the 2011 releases, violent felons spent an average of 78 months in custody, as compared to an average of 80 months among 2007 releases. Overall, the average time served for all first releases increased from 43 months in 2007 to 47 months in 2011.

Section 4: TIME SERVED BY FELONY CLASS

FELONY CLASS BY FELONY OFFENDER STATUS

Class A-I and A-II felons accounted for 4% of the offenders released in 2011 (2% for Class A-I and 2% for Class A-II) (see Table 6). Twenty-three percent of the first releases were committed for Class B felonies; 18% for Class C; 33% for Class D; 18% for Class E felony offenses, and 4% were Youthful Offenders. In general a persistent felony offender is a person convicted of a felony after having previously been convicted of at least two felony offenses on separate occasions. Time served by felony crime class is presented in Figure 3 and Table 7. They show that Class A-I felony offenders served the longest average period of time in custody (273 months) while Youthful Offenders served the shortest (23 months).

(Year 2011 First Releases, N=15,118)



Table 8B shows average and median minimum sentence and time served by felony crime class. The cases are grouped into violent, non-violent, youthful offender and juvenile offender categories within the two predicate felony statuses. First felony offenders convicted of a violent offense served an average of 72 months whereas non-violent, first felons served an average of 25 months. Predicate felony offenders convicted of a violent felony served an average of 92 months, while non-violent predicate felony offenders served an average of 34 months.


TRENDS IN TIME SERVED FOR VIOLENT FELONY OFFENDERS

Average time served for violent felony offenders decreased between 2010 and 2011. Between 2007 and 2011, change in average time served varied by felony offender status. For first felony offenders convicted of a violent crime, the average total time served decreased from 75 months among 2007 first releases to 72 months among 2011 first releases (see Table 9 and Figure 4). The average time served by second and persistent felony offenders convicted of a violent felony has risen from 88 months among 2007 releases to 92 months for 2011 releases.

Section 5: TIME SERVED BY MINIMUM SENTENCE LENGTH

The total time served in prison for 2011 first releases was similar to minimum sentence length. This was particularly true for offenders with sentences of less than 12 months and those with sentences of 240 months or higher. However, a number of the first release population’s total time served fell below the court set minimum sentence (see Table 10). This resulted primarily from offenders that successfully completed early release programs such as Shock Incarceration or Merit Time¹³.


Section 6: TIME SERVED BY DRUG OFFENDERS

The average total time served by drug offenders in the 2011 first release population was 30 months. On average, second and persistent felony drug offenders served more time (35 months) than first felony drug offenders (23 months) (see Table 11 and Figure 5).

Section 7: DEMOGRAPHIC CHARACTERISTICS

GENDER AND RACE/ETHNIC STATUS

Forty percent of the women and 47% of the men in the 2011 first release population were African-American. Forty-one percent of women released were White, whereas 24% of men were White. Seventeen percent of women and 27% of men were Hispanic (see Table 12).

AGE AT RELEASE

The average age of offenders at the time of release was 35 years old. Female offenders released in 2011 were, on average, 2 years older (age 37) than male offenders (age 35) (see Table 13). White offenders were slightly older at release (age 36) than African-American offenders (age 34) and Hispanic offenders (age 35) (see Table 14).

REGION AND COUNTY OF COMMITMENT

In 2011, 48% of first releases were committed from New York City and 11% were committed from suburban New York City (Long Island, Westchester and Rockland counties.) Offenders committed from upstate counties with a major population center of at least 50,000 people made up 21% of releases, while those offenders from the remaining upstate counties made up another 20% of the first releases in 2011. Twenty-eight percent of females and 20% of males were committed from non-urban, upstate counties. Conversely, 49% of males and 38% of females were committed from New York City.
