PAROLE BOARD AND PRESUMPTIVE RELEASE DISPOSITIONS

Calendar Year 2015

(Preliminary Data)

Total Parole Board workload for calendar year 2015 was 12,450 hearings, including 260 administrative hearings for rescission decisions, INS-closed, alternate date considerations, or special considerations. Initial appearances made up 75% of the Parole Board interviews for calendar year 2015. The tables below summarize in detail Parole Board activity for the year.

Table 3 shows that during calendar year 2015, the Board of Parole and the Commissioner of the Department of Corrections and Community Supervision made determinations on 12,217 cases that were eligible for release to parole supervision. This was a decrease of 654 cases (-5.1%) compared to calendar year 2014. Of the 12,217 cases reviewed during 2015, 2,875 (23.5%) were approved for release. This rate of approval was 0.3% lower than calendar year 2014, when 3,059 (23.8%) of the 12,871 reported parole eligible cases were approved for release.

According to Table 4, there were 9,137 Initial appearances reported for calendar year 2015. This was 450 fewer (-5%) than the 9,587 reported for the same period in 2014 (see Table 5). The 24.8% approval rate for Initial hearings during 2015 was up 0.1% from the 24.7% reported in 2014.

The 3,080 Reappearances reported during 2015 were 204 fewer (-6%) than the 3,284 reported for 2014. The approval rate for Reappearances during 2015 was 19.8%, compared to 21.0% during 2014, a decrease of 1.2%.
