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## REPORT OVERVIEW

### *2015 RELEASES AND DISCHARGES FROM INCARCERATION*

This document describes the characteristics of inmates and incarcerated parolees released or discharged from incarceration under the custody of the New York State Department of Corrections and Community Supervision (DOCCS) during calendar year 2015 (N=25,030). The majority of this report will focus on inmates released from prison into the community for the first time on their current sentence (N=13,148); however this is only one of the two major ways an inmate can be released from a DOCCS facility (the other is a release after a return to prison for violating conditions of parole or post-release supervision). In addition, inmates can be released or discharged from DOCCS custody for reasons that include transfer to another agency, inmate death, and court ordered discharge.

This report presents information on these first releases and the length of time served in custody according to various legal history criteria such as commitment offense, felony class, category of commitment offense and minimum sentence length. For comparative purposes, there are also two tables that show trends in time served in custody across the years 2011 through 2015 (see Table 8 and Table 13).

## GLOSSARY OF TERMS

*This glossary of terms is a reference tool for readers and includes terms used in this report. In 2011, when the former NYS Division of Parole merged with the former Department of Correctional Services to form the NYS Department of Corrections and Community Supervision (DOCCS), efforts were made to define our joint populations and agency functions as clearly and comprehensively as possible.*

### Types of DOCCS Facilities

Correctional Facility – a traditional “prison” in which incarcerated offenders are housed.

Parole Program Facility – a facility that houses a specialized treatment program (for example, Willard Drug Treatment Campus, Edgecombe Residential Treatment Program, Orleans Parole Diversion Program, Hudson Parole Diversion Program) for offenders under Community Supervision or returned to prison for violating conditions of parole.

### Types of DOCCS Offenders

Offender – a convicted felon under the jurisdiction of DOCCS.

Inmate – an incarcerated offender under the custody of DOCCS who is assigned to a state correctional facility.

Parolee – an offender who is under Community Supervision, including those who are incarcerated or supervised out of state.

### Types of DOCCS Program Participants

Alt 90 Participants – technical parole violators who had their parole supervision revoked and are participating in the 90-day alternative drug treatment program at the Willard Drug Treatment Campus as DOCCS inmates.

Alt 45 Participants – technical parole violators who had their parole supervision revoked and are participating in the 45-day alternative drug treatment program at Edgecombe as DOCCS inmates.

Willard Judicially Sanctioned Offender (JS) – offenders who were sentenced by the court to the Willard Drug Treatment Campus as an alternative to incarceration in a DOCCS general confinement facility and are participating in the program as incarcerated parolees.

Willard Parole Violator (PV) – parole violators who were revoked and restored to the Willard Drug Treatment Program. These offenders are under Community Supervision and are participating in the program as incarcerated parolees.

Parole Diversion Program (PDP) Participants – offenders who have been removed from the community to participate in a 45-day treatment program at a parole program facility (e.g., Edgecombe Residential Treatment, Orleans PDP, Hudson PDP). These offenders are under Community Supervision and are participating in the program as incarcerated parolees.

## **Types of DOCCS Offender Movement**

Release from prison – the exit of an offender from a correctional facility to the community to complete a term of Community Supervision (e.g., parole release, conditional release).

Discharge from prison – the exit from a correctional facility of an offender who will not be completing a period of time under Community Supervision (e.g., death, maximum expiration of sentence).

Release to supervision – the entrance of an offender to Community Supervision’s jurisdiction (e.g., release from prison, Willard Judicially Sanctioned Case, a Juvenile Offender released from an Office of Children and Family Services secure facility).

## INTRODUCTION

In April 2011, the former New York State Department of Correctional Services merged with the former New York State Division of Parole to form the New York State Department of Corrections and Community Supervision (DOCCS). As a result of this merger, this report includes information on all inmates and parolees under the jurisdiction of DOCCS who are incarcerated in a correctional facility or a parole program facility.

**Offender Releases During Calendar Year 2015:** Although the majority of this report focuses on inmates first released from custody to the community during 2015, this introductory section provides some background regarding all inmates and parolees released or discharged from DOCCS facilities during 2015. There were 25,030 releases during calendar year 2015 (see Table 1). Total inmate releases during 2015 include inmates who were participants in either the Alt 90 or Alt 45 program (1,003 or 4%).

During 2015, 89% (22,354) of releases from DOCCS facilities occurred among inmates and 11% (2,676) were among incarcerated parolees (see Table 2). Most (78%) of the inmate releases during 2015 were to the community to complete a term of Community Supervision. Among these releases, there were 1,716 (9%) Alternate program participants.

There were 2,863 (11%) inmates that were released in 2015 and were not required to complete a term of Community Supervision. Of these 2,863 “other” inmate releases, 2,303 (80%) were released after serving the maximum time on their sentence.

Incarcerated parolee releases made up the remaining 11% (2,676) of the total releases from DOCCS facilities in 2015. Of the incarcerated parolee releases, more than one-third (37%) were Willard PV’s.

## SECTION 1: TYPE OF RELEASE


Of the 22,354 inmate releases in 2015, 7,492 (34%) were released to Community Supervision as a result of Parole Board decisions<sup>1</sup>, another 9,051 (40%) were released to Community Supervision after reaching a conditional release date, 1,716 (8%) were released after participation in the Alt 90 or Alt 45 program, and 2,303 (10%) were released with no further supervision as a result of serving time until the maximum expiration of their sentence. There were also 1,232 (6%) inmates released who reached the maximum expiration of their sentence, but were required to have Post-Release Supervision in the community. The sum of these five release types, 21,794, is considered to be the number of releases to the community. Most of these cases (89%) were released to complete a term of Community Supervision. In addition, 560 inmates were released or discharged from the custody of DOCCS in 2015 by transfer to other agency, court ordered discharge, escape, absconder, temporary release arrest, offender death, and other release types.

**(2015 Total Releases, N= 22,354)**




**2015 First Release Demographics:** A significant portion (59%) of the 22,354 inmates released or discharged (13,148) from DOCCS custody in 2015 were identified as first releases. These were inmates who were released to the community for the **first time** on their current sentence due to release by the Board of Parole (2,915), release due to reaching their conditional release date (including maximum expiration with post-release supervision) (9,888), or release based on reaching maximum expiration of sentence (345) (see Table 4 and Figure 2).

**The tables in subsequent sections of this report are based solely on the 13,148 inmates identified as first releases.**

2015 First Releases from Prison (N=13,148)**





## SECTION 2: COMMITMENT OFFENSE BY GENDER

Seven percent (963) of first releases were women and 93% (12,185) were men.<sup>2</sup>

A larger proportion of men released in 2015 (39%) were committed for violent felonies than women (23%). Conversely, a larger proportion of women released were committed for either drug offenses or property and other offenses (26% and 38%, respectively) than were men (22% and 23%, respectively) (see Figure 3).

<sup>2</sup> As of December 31, 2015, 5% of the under custody population, which totaled 52,344, were female offenders (N=2,443).

Of the 13,148 first releases in 2015, 38% were committed for violent felony offenses, 12% for other coercive offenses, 23% for drug offenses, 24% for property and other types of offenses, and 4% as Youthful or Juvenile Offenders (see Table 5).

## SECTION 3: TIME SERVED BY COMMITMENT OFFENSE

The average “total time served” (i.e., state time plus jail time) for first releases in 2015 was 49 months and the median was 32 months. The average “state time only” for these releases was 41 months and the median was 23 months (see Table 6). Inmates convicted for VFO crimes served the longest sentences prior to release (average of 81 months of prison and jail time) while Drug Offenders served the least amount of time prior to release (average of 28 months of prison and jail time).

## TIME SERVED BY FELONY OFFENDER STATUS

Inmates sentenced as repeat felony offenders generally serve longer prison sentences than those sentenced as first felony offenders. On average, second and persistent<sup>3</sup> felony offenders were incarcerated 10 months longer (50 months) than first felony offenders (40 months). Second and persistent violent felons served an average of 14 months longer than first-time violent felons (see Table 7).

TRENDS IN TIME SERVED (2011-2015)

Among 2015 releases, violent felons spent an average of 81 months in custody, which was slightly larger than the average of 78 months of time served by 2011 releases. Overall, the average time served for all first releases increased from 47 months in 2011 to 49 months in 2015.

## SECTION 4: TIME SERVED BY FELONY CLASS

### FELONY CLASS BY FELONY OFFENDER STATUS


Class A-I and A-II felons accounted for 4% (543) of the offenders released in 2015 (2.6% for Class A-I and 1.6% for Class A-II) (see Table 9). Crimes that fall into the A-1 felony class include murder, arson, kidnapping, and conspiracy. There are also drug offenses that fall into the A-1 felony class and they include criminal sale of controlled substance, criminal possession of controlled substance, attempted criminal sale, and attempted criminal possession. More specific information on A-1 drug offenders is presented in subsequent sections. Twenty percent of the first releases were committed for Class B felonies; 19% for Class C; 34% for Class D; 19% for Class E felony offenses; and 3% were Youthful Offenders.

Time served by felony crime class is presented in Figure 4 and Table 10. They show that Class A-I Felony Offenders served the longest average period of time in custody (286 months) while Youthful Offenders and Class E Felony Offenders served the shortest (25 months). On average, these offenders are serving longer than the average minimum sentences as a result of not being granted release by the Parole Board at Initial Interview.

## *FELONY CLASS BY TIME SERVED*

Table 11 shows the average and median minimum sentence and time served by felony crime class, grouped by crime type and sorted by predicate felony status.<sup>4</sup> On average, drug offenders serve less time than the average aggregate minimum sentence because they are more likely to participate in Shock,<sup>5</sup> or have a determinate sentence.<sup>6</sup>

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<sup>4</sup> A predicate felony offender is a person who is sentenced by the courts as a second or persistent felony offender.

<sup>5</sup> In July 1987, New York State established the Shock Incarceration Program with legislation which mandated that DOCCS create a six-month program that would prepare non-violent inmates for early parole release consideration. The program was to operate in special facilities and to provide a schedule of rigorous physical activity, intensive regimentation, discipline, and drug rehabilitation.

<sup>6</sup> A determinate sentence is a sentence ordered by a judge that has a defined length of time with guidelines determined by the Legislature. Determinate sentences cannot be released early by the Parole Board, but inmates can be released conditionally after serving 6/7s of their determinate term of prison.

Table 12 shows average and median minimum sentence and time served by felony crime class. The cases are grouped into violent, non-violent, youthful offender and juvenile offender categories within the two predicate felony statuses. First felony offenders convicted of a violent offense served an average of 77 months whereas non-violent, first felons served an average of 25 months. Predicate felony offenders convicted of a violent felony served an average of 91 months, while non-violent predicate felony offenders served an average of 34 months.


## TRENDS IN TIME SERVED BY VIOLENT FELONY OFFENDERS

Between 2011 and 2015, change in average time served varied by felony offender status. For first felony offenders convicted of a violent crime, the average total time served increased from 72 months among 2011 first releases to 77 months among 2015 first releases (see Table 13 and Figure 5). The average time served by second and persistent felony offenders convicted of a violent felony has decreased slightly from 92 months among 2011 releases to 91 months among 2015 releases.

## SECTION 5: TIME SERVED BY MINIMUM SENTENCE LENGTH

The total time served in prison for 2015 first releases was similar to minimum sentence length. This was particularly true for offenders with sentences of less than 12 months and those with sentences of 240 months or higher. However, a number of the first release population's total time served fell below the court set minimum sentence (see Table 14). This resulted primarily from offenders that successfully completed early release programs such as Shock Incarceration or Merit Time.<sup>7</sup> The table also shows that some inmates served longer than their court imposed minimum sentence. For example, of the 2,302 inmates sentenced to 12-17 months, 22% (513) served less time while 47% (1,072) served more time.


## SECTION 6: TIME SERVED BY DRUG OFFENDERS

The average total time served by drug offenders in the 2015 first release population was 28 months. On average, second and persistent felony drug offenders served more time (33 months) than first felony drug offenders (23 months) (see Table 15 and Figure 6). Those sentenced as A-1 felons serve significantly more time. Crimes that fall into the A-1 drug felony class include criminal possession of a controlled substance first degree, criminal sale of a controlled substance first degree along with attempted possession of a controlled substance first degree and attempted sale of controlled possession first degree. The weight of the substances determines A-1 drug classification. Possession of an aggregate weight of eight ounces or more of a narcotic substance, or methadone that weighs 5,760 milligrams or more is a class A-1 felony. Sale of a narcotic substance with an aggregate weight of two ounces or more, and sale of methadone equaling or exceeding 2,880 milligrams is also an A-1 drug felony.

## SECTION 7: DEMOGRAPHIC CHARACTERISTICS

### GENDER AND RACE/ETHNIC STATUS

Thirty-three percent (313) of the women and 45% (5,443) of the men in the 2015 first release cohort were African American. Forty-nine (469) percent of women and 26% (3,211) of men released were White. Sixteen percent (157) of women and 26% (3,138) of men were Hispanic (see Table 16).

## AGE AT RELEASE

The average age of offenders at the time of release was 36 years old. During 2015, 14 offenders under age 18 were released. Female offenders released in 2015, on average, were almost 1 year older (age 37) than male offenders (age 36) (see Table 17). White Offenders were slightly older at release (age 37) than Hispanic Offenders (age 36) and African American offenders (age 35) (see Table 18).

## *REGION AND COUNTY OF COMMITMENT*

In 2015, 44% (5,720) of first releases were committed from New York City and 10% (1,325) were committed from suburban New York City (Long Island, Westchester and Rockland counties) (see Table 19). Offenders committed from upstate counties with a major population center of at least 50,000 people made up 22% (2,919) of releases, while those offenders from the remaining upstate counties made up another 24% (3,184) of the first releases in 2015. Forty-one percent (393) of females and 23% (2,791) of males were committed from non-urban, upstate counties. Conversely, 44% (5,415) of males and 32% (305) of females were committed from New York City.
